In January, Sharon and Jerry went to the Winter Consumer Electronics Show in Las Vegas, where Sega was to announce the virtual reality project Jerry had been working on. And, concurrently, ASG Technologies was also presenting the Video Jukebox that Jerry had designed. Due to the rushed and somewhat ill-timed nature of the Sega project, the virtual reality demonstration was canceled. But, the Video Jukebox was a big hit and ASG started making plans for producing it in time for Christmas, 1994. After returning from CES, Sharon started writing video game scripts for ASG.

In March, Jerry went back to Florida on a business trip and stayed with his mother in Sanford. He didn't have a lot of spare time, but did get to drive around a bit and meet some old friends.
